Step 3: Map	Draft a 4-5 paragraph skeleton emphasizing narrative arc or thesis flow.	Ensure each section links to the next using semantic hooks instead of arbitrary sequence transitions (e.g., *Next, Then*).

2. SYLLABUS GENRE CONSTRAINTS & STRATEGY MATRIX

Gen I: Personal Recount / Narrative

- **Syllabus Focus:** Evoking authentic emotional progression, internal monologue, and structural resolution.
- **The Golden Rule:** Avoid linear chronologies ("and then I did this"). Force structural tension on a singular, definitive turning point.

Tutor Hack: Balance individual responsibility against systemic/corporate forces to present a uniquely mature thesis.

Transform predictable, simplistic narratives into emotionally mature masterpieces:

C6/B4 Plot Template **The Competition Trope:** "I trained day and night for the National School Games. On the race day, I ran fast and won first place. My parents and peers were incredibly proud of me."

A1 Narrative Pivot **The Internal Growth Catalyst:** "Focus shifts away from the physical medal to a quiet realization of internal transformation. The pride stemmed not from dominating rivals, but from conquering my own crippling fear of failure after an agonizing mid-season knee injury."

5. CRITICAL ERROR ERADICATION CHECKLIST

Markers cross-examine essays for these common structural vulnerabilities. Eradicate them entirely:

- Vulnerability 1: The "Thesaurus Vomit" Trap:** Do not force complex words into sentences where they distort natural clarity.
 - Avoid:** *"My monochromatic cognitive faculties extricated the conundrum."*
 - Execute:** Clear, evocative syntax always trumps unearned obscurity.
- Vulnerability 2: Orphaned Narrative Reflections:** A narrative reflection should never be isolated strictly to the last two lines of the essay. Instead, weave self-reflection consistently through your internal monologue across all body paragraphs.
- Vulnerability 3: The Superficial Discursive Thesis:** Avoid one-sided, biased emotional rants in your discursive or argumentative essays. To score highly, treat the opposing perspective with deep respect and nuance before executing a systematic, evidence-driven refutation.
